



What are Demola projects?

Demola offers university students the opportunity to do meaningful project studies as part of an **interdisciplinary team and international community**.

Project work follows an 8–10-week creative process in which we utilise design thinking, foresight and systems thinking methodologies and unlock our creative, curious and optimistic potential.

In collaboration with the Namibia University of Science and Technology, the project work is done together with Demola's experts. The teams will work in person in Windhoek.

Meaningful project topics

Project topics are carefully planned by Demola in cooperation with various stakeholders. In Demola, you can solve significant future problems, and design and demonstrate what the future will look like.

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FAQ

What's the working language? *English.*

How many hours per week does the project work take?

Usually 10-15 h/week. Some weeks are lighter, but by the end of the process, it may require more of your effort. We don't require you to report hours, though, and the amount of time teams dedicate to the project may vary.

Is it possible to join if I have already graduated / am a first-year student / am in a PhD programme / taking a gap year?

Yes, it is. Everybody, regardless of their study experience or background, is welcome. Just make sure you are available for all the in-person events and weekly meetings with your team.

What are the requirements for becoming selected in the programme?

Your motivation is key when it comes to writing the application. You don't need to master the project topic in advance; we are more interested in your personal thoughts, experiences and your curiosity towards creating something new.
